
The people there are, usually, our good and faithful partners but if you have any problems getting what you need from them, let us know!

Equal Rights for All - Update

The NY State Board of Elections worked on a draft of the simple language for the New York State Constitutional Amendment ballot.

Public comments were solicited and the final form remained the same as the draft.

That is currently being challenged in the Courts as being not consistent with the original legislative intent and not consistent with the requirement to keep the language at an 8th grade understanding.

The simple language that the NY State Attorney General's Office offered is very good:

The Amendment - "Protects against unequal treatment by New York and local governments no matter your sex, age, disability status, ethnicity, or national origin. Protects LGBT and pregnant people. Protects abortion."

The Mid-Hudson ERA task force is working with Voter Services to distribute information and write postcards to encourage voters to turn their ballots over and vote!

LWVMHR Observer Jane Simkin Smith begins her coverage of the August Dutchess County Legislature Meeting -

"Once again, the dominant issue addressed at this session – by the public and the legislators -- was Resolution 132, authorizing acceptance of a state grant in order to construct an emergency homeless

shelter at 26 Oakley Street in the City of Poughkeepsie, and to amend the county budget in order to fund, design, and manage construction of the project. 20 members of the public (including five members of the Poughkeepsie Common Council) addressed the resolution before and after it was voted upon; all except one were residents of the City of Poughkeepsie and all but one voiced strong opposition. As in previous sessions, the objections were to the location in an already blighted neighborhood, to the failure of legislators to listen to stakeholders, answer their questions, or to even visit the location, to the financial burden, to bullying, racism, a lack of trust and a lack of communication."


Look up your candidate's stances on their campaign website.

LWV and Orange County Board of Elections present program on Election Security and Transparency

On Thursday, August 1, 2024, about 25 Orange County residents attended a program entitled "Election Security and Transparency" sponsored by the LWV Mid-Hudson and the Orange County Board of Elections. It was hosted by the Albert Wisner Library in Warwick, NY.

After a brief introduction from League personnel stating the League's mission and why this topic is so important in our current political climate of mis- and disinformation, two BOE representatives were introduced, Ada Kirkpatrick and Frank Sambets. Their presentation described the ways that the physical process of tallying votes is done in a manner specifically designed to be accurate and secure. For example, they explained how every step of the process is performed by trained election personnel from BOE, one Republican and one Democrat. This ensures that all actions taken are non-partisan and in compliance with New York state voting laws. In addition, they described how representatives of political parties or candidates and organizations are allowed to observe and monitor election activities.

They described how on election night, after vote counts are collected from every machine and results reported to headquarters, ballots and equipment are then securely transported back to the BOE. They said all county boards of elections must conduct post-election audits to further verify results. The many safeguards utilized by the BOE were described in detail and, through personal anecdotes and incidents in which the security and accuracy of the final result was questioned, proved to be correct.

People in attendance asked many questions during the 2 hour presentation and some even took notes. All were answered, often with humor, and in great detail, and the BOE officials were able to dispel some of the more common myths about what really happens in our election process. The general consensus seemed to be satisfaction for having an opportunity to hear the process explained and be assured about the secure process.

Engaging Young Voters at Bard College


