# Redistricting Still A Problem in New York State

Check out this interactive Redistricting Map that shows the proposed changes done by the Legislature and NOT done with the public input garnered by the Independent Redistricting Commission (see the League of Women Voters of New York State, below): MAP



"The people of New York should be outraged by the recent inaction of the Independent Redistricting Commission (IRC). By not working together and instead, maintaining partisan allegiances, the Commissioners disregard the thousands of hours spent by citizens to provide input on proposed redistricting lines that reflect their communities. The Commissioners chose to ignore their constitutional obligation to propose maps that are in the best interests of the State and its voters. The League of Women Voters believes that the IRC exemplified the worst of state government as it torpedoed the redistricting reforms approved by voters in 2014."



# Ulster County Resource Recovery Agency Wins Composting Award

Each year, the US Composting Council recognizes the Best of the



Best in the compost manufacturing and organics recycling industries. On their website, USCC describes the prestige of their annual awardees as "these winners have given generously of their time and talent to further the compost industry and to protect the environment for future generations." The Small-Scale Compost Manufacturer of the Year Award is awarded to a small-scale composting facility in the US (< 10,000 tons per year throughout), public or private sector, which has displayed excellence in both compost production and marketing/distribution. # **Environmental Impact**

Agrivoltaics and Small Scale Farming

So many farmers are struggling to

keep themselves afloat today. The average age of a farmer in the US is 57.5 years and starting to look toward retirement. Fewer young people are looking to make their livelihood in farming because it is demanding work without sufficient financial reward. Small farmers struggle to make ends meet. Large agribusinesses have taken over food production, but this type of farmland expansion often ends in soil depletion from lack of crop rotation or an inferior product that often contains unacceptable amounts of pesticides or is genetically modified in a way that degrades the quality of our food.

A real, viable solution to the problem is agrivoltaics, a process by which land is used simultaneously for photovoltaic power generation and agriculture. Solar panels can be installed over livestock grazing lands, providing shade and protection from the elements, while allowing grasses to grow and thrive. They can also be installed over food crops. Agrivoltaic farming is now used in the western United States to stave off drought by reducing water needs while creating a cooler microclimate at the ground level for more successful harvests. New York State, especially its western segment, is already poised for an agrovoltaic revolution, marrying renewable energy and farmland and keeping farmers financially viable while supporting our need for sustainable and reliable power. It is an elegant solution for a serious problem.

We can thank Adolf Goetzberger and Armin Zastrow for this technique, conceived in 1981. The term agrivoltaic was coined in 2011.
