Did you know that as a League member, you belong to a "club" that is helping to save democracy? The value of clubs and community efforts in general (e.g. churches

and even bowling leagues) are the theme of the film <u>JOIN OR DIE</u> about why you should join a group and how the fate of America depends on it. It builds on the lifelong work of Harvard prof emeritus, Robert Putnam, whose many books - especially the best-seller <u>BOWLING ALONE</u> - have helped all of us see that if we don't get together with other people and talk about things, democracy can't really function.

We will be working with other groups in our area to have showings of this film (it's a nationwide effort even beyond LWV) but, besides that, we will be doing many other things to do what Putnam talks about. The more of us who help, the more effective we will be, so read elsewhere about activities that might interest you and "jump aboard"!

The League has been a go-to organization for many, many women and men who want to contribute to their communities effectively. When I lived in the Utica area, I noticed that the head of the Youth Bureau and so many other such agencies "came up" through the League. - a visit with your county executive and possibly your county clerk

We will also be holding Zoom meetings that can later be posted on our website for continual use by the public. Example: we did one last spring on Running for School Board that included current board members and a key state level person explaining what running requires and what it's like to serve. People start registering to run in February so we will spread the word about this Zoom to all the school district clerks. Similar topics we'd like to do are service on county legislatures and town boards and one just on running for office in general.

We are now regularly watching our Dutchess and Ulster county legislatures in action through our Observer Corps and we hope to include Orange Co soon, too. Jane Simkin Smith wrote an article about the Dutchess County Legislative Meeting she observed from December 9th. She noted -

"The main business of this session was the approval of the 2025 budget. Five amendments to the budget prepared County Executive Sue Serino were offered by both Republican and Democratic legislators, and each amendment was approved unanimously. Members from both parties expressed appreciation to both Ms. Serino (who was present) for her open-minded and collaborative approach to the budget development process, as well as to the Budget Office, the Budget and Finance committee, and commissioners of the various executive agencies for their, help, responsiveness and transparency.Democratic legislators pointed out that the level of collaboration and cooperation was unlike prior years under prior administrations when they had had no voice."

Newly Released LWV Book

Impact on Issues 2024-2026: A Guide to Public Policy Decisions of the League of Women Voters, by the LWV of the United States.


Throughout its history, the League has served dual purposes of education and advocacy, engaging in studies on representative government, international relations, natural resources, and social policy. This version of **"Impact on Issues"** covers the League's advocacy efforts beginning in the 1960s.

First each position, as approved by a League's national convention, is presented. Then historical information about the issue follows,putting the policy in context. Policies and explanations are put forth in a nonpartisan manner, as is the hallmark of the organization.

The book, available through Amazon in paperback, would make a fabulous sequential basis for a reading group. It also could serve as a definitive reference book as to where the League stands on various issues.

Check it out. It's worth more than the \$6.99 that Amazon is charging for it. A shame that it's not available in our local bookstores.
